You have earned the right to certain veterans benefits. Use this form to make it easier for your family in case of an emergency. Make sure to retain a copy for your own records. If possible, attach a copy of veteran's discharge/separation paper.

If either you or your spouse had a previous marriage, it is important that you list how these marriages ended (death, divorce, annulment) and that you list the dates, and places of termination, as the VA needs proof that your marriage to the veteran was legal. If possible, attach copy of veteran's discharge or separation paper for your file.

In order to have a record of this information to establish eligibility for veterans and widows benefits in the future, it is suggested a copy be furnished the Veterans Service Agency in your area and a copy of your discharge and this document should be filed in your County Clerk's office.
